

3. What happens if I get accepted into the program (fall or spring cohort), but there are no more seats because I waited too long to sign the acceptance letter and remit my deposit?

Should a student be admitted to the program (spring or fall cohort), and have this happen, we do offer a waiting list for the next cohort. For example, if a student was accepted to begin in the fall cohort but waited too long to sign their acceptance letter and remit their deposit to secure a seat in that cohort, the student would then be placed on the waitlist for the spring cohort, and then begin in the spring. This is why we strongly encourage accepted students to sign the acceptance letter and remit their deposit as soon as possible.

4. How long is the program?

The program is 15 months long and courses will take place during summer sessions.

For the fall cohort: Classes begin in the fall and students complete the program in December of the following fall.

For the spring cohort: Classes begin in the spring and students complete the program in May of the following spring.

5. Where will classes be held?

Classes and labs are scheduled to be held at Stockton's site in Manahawkin.

Clinical experiences will be held at health care facilities throughout south Jersey and students provide their own transportation to clinical sites.

6. How many days a week are classes held?

Students can expect to be in class, lab, or clinical three to four days a week. Students may be required to attend clinical in the evening or on weekends.

7. Can I work while I attend the program?

Accelerated nursing programs are intense and very demanding of students' time. Students are strongly discouraged from working.

8. How much does the program cost?

Tuition for the accelerated program courses is the same as all Stockton undergraduate courses. However, there are additional expenses associated with the nursing curriculum.

Students need to be aware that unexpected fees or costs related to clinical requirements could arise during their enrollment in nursing at Stockton. Every effort will be made to provide students with advanced notice should additional costs or fees be required.
