Galloway, NJ— Likely voters in the 1st Legislative District still favor the incumbent Democrats over their Republican challengers, according to the Richard Stockton College/Zogby Poll commissioned by the William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy.

The State Senate race between Democrat Jeff Van Drew and Republican challenger David DeWeese is now somewhat closer than the latest Stockton College/Zogby Poll in September when Van Drew led DeWeese 56 percent to 23 percent with only 19 percent unsure. In the current poll
