Finally, participants suggested that colleges recognize community engagement and development as a core business focus, to improve the quality of life for individuals regionally, whether or not attending college, thereby serving as an anchor for innovative partnerships fostering education, health, public safety, and job creation.

Important outcomes of the Roundtable discussion are:
