

# Andrzejczak Leads Testa in 1<sup>st</sup> District Senate race; Assembly Election Closer

Both cell and landline phone sample randomly selected from voter lists was provided by Aristotle. Data were weighted based on U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey data for New Jersey 1<sup>st</sup> Legislative District on variables of age, ethnicity, education level, sex and region. The poll's margin of error is +/- 4.4 percentage points at a 95 percent confidence level for statewide results. MOE is higher for subsets.
